



Latest Project:


- Establishing our first Historic District 5th Avenue Business
 District, also including select buildings on St Charles
- Preliminary boundaries established; HPC approved proposed
 Historic District and 85 page narrative
- Next step finalize map, then to full Village Board for approval; will need 51% owner approval to finalize per ordinance
- Goal is to make tax credits available to properly rehabilitated commercial buildings that are eligible









































Successes and Challenges
