#### **REGULAR AGENDA**

- The commission discussed and voted to review the 2015 I codes. Staff liaison Cutaia mentioned he had not purchased the International Energy Code and the International Plumbing Code because the state of Illinois had mandated them. Commissioner Hudson mentioned that the codes do not mention toilet location, grey water systems and roof drainage systems. A discussion occurred about the necessity to regulate those items. Commissioner Hudson mentioned that he taught the code changes class and may be able to present a power point of the changes between the 2009 and 2015 codes. The Commission agreed to put off reviewing the 2015 Code books at this meeting.
- Liaison Cutaia reported that the plan review turnaround time is approximately a week and staff is still tweaking the new computer program but is being used more and more.
- Liaison Cutaia passed out the 2015 IRC, IBC, IMC, IFGC, and the IFC to those whom attended along with a copy of the adopted ordinance.
- Liaison Cutaia mentioned the retirement of Ken Welch, HR GREEN Plans Examiner. He mentioned that the industry is drying up on experienced professionals. Commissioner Hudson had agreed by adding how difficult it was to obtain a new inspector in Oak Brook. He contributed some of the reasons to the decreased opportunities of construction education in high school and community colleges.
- Commission Hudson discussed his proposed handrail award. The discussion will continue.
