

## **DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY**

Pursuant to the authority vested in the office of the Village President of the Village of Oak Park ("Village") by Village of Oak Park Ordinance Number 20-047, Section 11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/11-1-6, and Section 11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3305/11, it is my judgment that a local state of emergency exists in the Village on this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of June, 2020. I make this finding due to the Oak Park Police Department receiving reports that, and directly observing, persons acting together and in conjunction with each other to commit "Offenses Against the Public Peace" as defined by Section 17-1-5 of the Oak Park Village Code and the offense of "Destroying Property" as defined by Section 17-1-7 of the Oak Park Village Code in the Village which offenses included but were not limited to criminal property damage and graffiti on May 31, 2020, June 1, 2020 and June 2, 2020. I further make this finding due to Section 2(d) of Governor JB Pritzker's Executive Order 2020-38 (COVID-19 Executive Order No. 36) which prohibits "any gathering of more than ten people" issued on May 29, 2020 which runs through June 27, 2020 to limit the spread of COVID-19 disease in the State of Illinois and applicable in the Village of Oak Park.


Pursuant to the above, I am declaring a local state of emergency in the Village of Oak Park. This Declaration of Local State of Emergency shall be filed with the Village Clerk as soon as practicable.

Pursuant to this declaration, a **CURFEW** is ordered in the Village beginning at **9:00 p.m.** on June 2, 2020 and ending at **6:00 a.m.** on June 3, 2020 for all persons for the protection and preservation of the public peace, safety and welfare. During said curfew, it shall be unlawful for any persons to travel on any public street or in any public place. The local state of emergency declared herein shall expire on June 3, 2020 at 6:00 a.m.

Those persons traveling to and from work/places of employment, traveling for essential work, which shall include law enforcement personnel, fire, public works and members of the news media, or for medical emergencies shall be excluded from this curfew. For purposes of this Declaration, "travel" means, without limitation, travel on foot, bicycle, skateboard, scooter, motorcycle, automobile, public transit, or any other mode of transporting a person from one location to another, and "public place" means any place, whether on privately or publicly owned property, accessible to the general public, including, but not limited to, public streets, roads, alleys, highways, driveways, sidewalks, parks, vacant lots, and unsupervised property.

It is unlawful for any person to violate the provisions of the curfew ordered by this Declaration. It is unlawful for any person to fail to obey promptly any lawful direction of a police officer acting in the performance of his or her duty or power in the enforcement of the provisions of this Declaration pursuant to Section 19-1-15 of the Oak Park Village Code. Any person guilty of such violation shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine as set forth in Section 1-1-5 of the Oak Park Village Code.

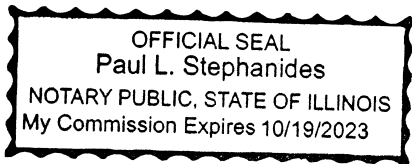
